June 2024 Monthly Report **SUBJECT:** 

As we continue to move through summer months, the WMTFD continues to see a significant increase in call volume. As you will see in the report, for the month of June the members responded to 139 calls for service. This is a 21% increase from June of 2023. This may be the most calls for service in a single month that the WMTFD has responded too.

However, despite the significant increases, the members continue to turn out and provide outstanding service to the community. I couldn't ask for a better department!

#### **TOWNSHIP EMERGENCY RESPONSES CONTINUED**

- There was a total of 909 personnel that responded to the incidents with an average of 9 per incident. (Average does not include Duty Officer & Fire Police Only Calls). This is a 12.5% increase from last month.
- Year to date, a total of 3,998 personnel responded to the incidents.
- We are at a 14.00% increase in call volume from last year.

#### **RECRUITMENT & RETENTION**

During the month of June, the WMTFD received a total of two (2) inquiries through our social media outlets. Out of those two (2) inquiries, we provided one (1) application and received one (1) application back.

There were no new members brought into membership during the month of June.
